Adult Outpatient Treatment REACH Program

REACH Recovery Services is an

evidence-based alcohol and drug outpatient treatment program. REACH is designed to meet the needs of adults, eighteen years or older, who are identified as abusing or dependent on alcohol and/or other drugs. Clients must be medically and mentally stable and willing to commit to a program of abstinence with minimal supervision.



Adult Outpatient Treatment Services begin with...

A FREE initial screening to determine appropriateness for treatment.

A psycho-social assessment and individual interviews to identify the client's strengths and weaknesses to develop individualized treatment goals.

OUTPATIENT PROGRAMS

Adult Intensive Outpatient Treatment (TRA) is open to any adult identified as abusing or dependent on alcohol or other drugs. It includes:

- A minimum of 12 hours of service weekly both individual and group
- Chemical dependency counseling, education and life skills training
- 12-Step support group attendance on nontreatment days encouraged

Adult Intensive Outpatient Treatment — Specialized Female

(TRF) is open to any adult woman with dependent children and pregnant women identified as abusing or dependent on alcohol or other drugs. It includes:

- A minimum of 12 hours of service weekly both individual and group
- Chemical dependency counseling, education and life skills training that facilitate stable recovery and preservation of the client's family
- o 12-Step support group attendance on nontreatment days encouraged

Parenting

BVCASA offers a 6 week parenting program, held 2 times a week (a total of 12 sessions), using an Evidenced Based Practice curriculum for parents identified as substance abusers.

Aftercare

A 3 month aftercare program is offered once a week (12-14 sessions) to individuals who have successfully completed adult outpatient treatment - at no cost for BVCASA Clients.
